Farm Dog Certification Test - What is it?

In order to qualify for the Farm Dog Certification title you must pass the test under 2 different judges. There are 12 test elements. Our test is on Sept 22. The secretary sent out the premium list. If you don't have it, contact Julie Swinland blackforestgsd@msn.com.

1. Greet Evaluator - Initial Dog Appraisal

Handler approaches evaluator, dog stops at handler's side on a loose lead while evaluator performs introduction.

 Perform a Walk Pattern around Farm Environment and by Passive Stranger The handler walks the dog on a <u>loose lead</u> in a prescribed pattern through farm objects. A passive stranger sits quietly on course.

3. Jump on Hay/Straw Bale

The handler instructs the dog to jump up on a bale of hay and stay on the bale for a minimum of 10 seconds while maintaining a loose lead.

4. Walk by Farm Animal(s)

The handler walks the dog on a loose lead in view of penned farm animal(s) approximately 30 feet away from the fence line housing farm animal(s).

5. Walk Over or Through Unusual Surfaces

The handler walks the dog on a loose lead over or through three different unusual surfaces, including a plastic tarp, safe wooded surface, and another typical farm environment surface.

6. Supervised Separation

The handler places the dog in a freestanding kennel or dog crate and walks out of sight for a minimum of 1 minute.

7. Pass Through a Gate

The handler and dog navigate through a gate on a loose lead, the dog must wait calmly as the handler opens the gate, calls dog through the gate opening and closes the gate.

8. Handler Feeds Livestock

The handler performs a farm chore of feeding farm animals while the dog is secured a minimum of 30 feet away from the animal enclosure.

9. Reaction to Another Dog

The handler is positioned in a designated area with the dog at side on <u>loose lead</u>. The dog may stand, down or sit. Another dog is walked by on lead approximately 10 feet away.

10. Reaction to Noise Distraction

The handler may stand or quietly walk in a designated area with the dog at side on <u>loose lead</u>. The assistant creates two background noises typical to a working farm environment.

11. Dog Approaches Livestock

The handler, with the dog at side on a <u>loose lead</u>, enters a fenced area that contains livestock within a separate enclosure. The dog is introduced to livestock and encouraged to approach the pen, the dog is then called back to the handler and returns readily when called.

12. Physical Examination

The handler physically examines the dog for any plant material, debris or objects that the dog may have collected while working on the farm.

OVERALL TEST ASSESSMENT: Was the dog consistently responsive to the handler and successfully exhibited self-control while exposed to a farm environment?

* To pass the FDC Test, dogs must pass all elements of the test, including test assessment.

6 Tick-Borne Diseases You Should Know About

Ticks are more than just creepy; they can spread a number of different diseases that affect both pets and people, and with changes in weather patterns, we are seeing the host ranges for these diseases expanding. Ticks can transmit microorganisms that cause Lyme disease, ehrlichiosis, Rocky Mountain spotted fever, anaplasmosis, hepatozoonosis, and babesiosis and no prevention is 100% effective 100% of the time. So what can you do to protect your pets and your family from tick-borne diseases? Learn the risks below, then about the importance of annual testing, and see more about parasite screening and prevention at Beware the Bug.

1. Ehrlichiosis

Canine ehrlichiosis is a relatively new disease and comes in multiple forms that are often specific to different U.S. regions. The disease is caused by a type of bacteria called Ehrlichia, which can affect multiple species including people and cats. Learn more about different forms of ehrlichiosis or see the number of reported cases in dogs in your area.

2. Anaplasmosis

Canine anaplasmosis can be found throughout the United States, primarily in the northeastern, mid-Atlantic, and north-central states, as well as California. Caused by a bacteria transmitted from ticks that have previously bitten host animals such as deer and rodents, anaplasmosis can cause joint pain, high fever, and more. Find out more about symptoms, diagnosis, and treatment of canine anaplasmosis or see the number of reported cases of canine anaplasmosis in your area.

3. Lyme Disease

The bacteria that causes Lyme disease is transmitted by two types of ticks – the Western black-legged tick and the deer tick – and can affect dogs of all ages, breeds, and sizes. The geographic range of Lyme disease is expanding and is now found in more U.S. states and some Canadian provinces. Ticks are often hard to spot, making it incredibly difficult to spot a tick bite, and symptoms of Lyme disease are often difficult to detect until several months after infection. Learn more about Lyme disease and the importance of protecting your pet or see the number of reported Lyme disease cases in dogs in your area.

4. Rocky Mountain Spotted Fever

Despite its name, Rocky Mountain spotted fever is found throughout the U.S. and Canada. This infection can appear suddenly, with severe illness that can be life threatening if not diagnosed quickly. Find out what to watch for and how it's diagnosed.

5. Babesiosis

This tick-borne disease is caused by a blood parasite that infects a dog's red blood cells. Dogs can become infected when feeding ticks pass the microscopic parasites, known as Babesia, to them. Like other tick-borne diseases, symptoms are often vague and sometimes difficult to identify. Learn more about signs, symptoms, and treatment of babesiosis.


6. Hepatozoonosis

Unlike other vector-borne diseases that are transmitted by tick bite, both forms of canine hepatozoonosis are transmitted when a dog eats or otherwise ingests an infected tick. Like other tick-borne diseases, symptoms are difficult to detect, but can include loss of appetite, weight loss, and depression. FROM WI I-94: Take I-94 east (if you are coming from St. Paul area) to Highway 65 (also the exit for Roberts). Go north (through New Richmond to Highway 64 - about 13 miles).
